



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## The 8 Coziest Restaurants With Fireplaces In New York City

### **The Evening Bar at the Smyth Hotel:**

Add this to your list of great dinner spots in Tribeca. The Evening Bar at the newly redesigned Smyth, a Thompson Hotel, features a double-sided fireplace and food by Andrew Carmellini, including foie gras and peanut butter and jelly sandwiches. *85 W. Broadway*



**Keens:**

This legendary steakhouse has been around since 1885, serving up some of the best steak in the city. The fireplace is in the Bull Moose room, which can be rented out for small parties. *72 W. 36th Street*



**The Nomad:**

Their famous foie gras-stuffed chicken is best enjoyed in the Fireplace room, with its antique French marble hearth. The Library is now only open to hotel guests after 4:30pm, but you can migrate over to the Nomad Bar next door after the meal. *1170 Broadway*



**Per Se:**

It doesn't get any better for fine dining on a wintry evening. Even if you can't nab a seat by the fireplace, the Central Park views will make up for it. *10 Columbus Circle*



**The Lobby Bar at the Bowery Hotel:**

This dimly lit lobby bar, furnished with leather and velvet armchairs, Persian rugs, and a vaulted sandstone fireplace, has some of the best people-watching in town. The bar stops serving food at 5pm, but you can always slip next door to Gemma for some Italian grub. *335 Bowery*



**The Place:**

A West Village staple, the Place has not one but two fireplaces, slate floors, and original oak beamed ceilings. Brunch is family-friendly and 10 percent of each bill is donated to one of 30 diverse charities. *310 W. 4th Street*



**The Lambs Club:**

Those in search of old New York should look no further than Geoffrey Zakarian's Lambs Club. The stellar wine list and 18th-century French fireplace make this a firm post- and pre-theater favorite. *132 W. 44th Street*



**The Rose Bar at Gramercy Park Hotel:**

Co-owned by artist Julian Schnabel, the Rose Bar is one of the city's top date spots. Tuesday and Thursdays nights are especially popular for the live jazz. 2
